The Jacksonville Symphony Celebrates National Hispanic Heritage Month with the Mambo Kings

Jacksonville, FL (July 25, 2017) --- The Jacksonville Symphony will celebrate National Hispanic Heritage Month with the Mambo Kings in concert on September 22, 23, and 24. The concerts will take place at 8:00pm on September 22/23 and 3:00pm on September 24.

"National Hispanic Heritage Month is a time to celebrate the histories, cultures and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America," said Robert Massey, President and Chief Executive Officer of the Jacksonville Symphony. "As part of the First Coast Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, we are delighted to participate in this celebration."

Mambo Kings, together since 1995, are one of the world's foremost Latin jazz ensembles. They have earned a national reputation for their blend of Afro-Cuban rhythms and jazz improvisation. The Mambo Kings made their orchestral premiere in 1997 with the Rochester Philharmonic and have since appeared in festivals and pop concerts across the country.
