## JACKSONVILLE SYMPHONY BEGINS MASTERWORKS SERIES SEASON WITH GERMAN GIANTS BEETHOVEN AND STRAUSS

Jacksonville, FL (September 19, 2018) --- The Jacksonville Symphony and Music Director Courtney Lewis will begin the *Florida Blue Masterworks Series* with *A Hero's Life*, featuring works by two well-known German composers, Ludwig van Beethoven and Richard Strauss.

The weekend of German giants will begin with an abbreviated performance on Thursday, September 27 for the Symphony's first *Regency Centers Symphony in 60* concert of the season. The concert will feature Beethoven's Fourth Symphony and patrons are welcome to come early at 5:30 p.m. to take part in happy hour in the Times-Union Center for the Performing Arts' lobby. Following the concert, the traditional *Symphony in 60* after-party goes on the road to Cowford Chophouse. Patrons can join staff and musicians on the Cowford rooftop. In celebration of the season, Cowford Chophouse has created a Stir Your Soul cocktail and a portion of the proceeds will go towards supporting the Jacksonville Symphony Youth Orchestras.

The 2018-2019 Symphony *Florida Blue Masterworks Series* will begin on Friday and Saturday, September 28 & 29. During the Masterworks performances, Beethoven's Fourth will be followed by Richard Strauss' epic tone poem *Ein Heldenleben*, "A Hero's Life." At the age of 34, Strauss decided to follow in the footsteps of Beethoven's Third Symphony, *Eroica*, and write a piece of music about a particularly heroic individual. For Beethoven, it was Napoleon Bonaparte. In the case of Strauss, he humbly wrote a symphonic story about himself. In a thrilling musical tale featuring his loving wife and battle against music critics, *Ein Heldenleben* is a perfect close to the first Masterworks Series weekend.
