This season marked a remarkable triumph for us, as our performances resonated with listeners in the community, across Florida and far beyond. Due to the efforts of our dedicated Board of Directors, staff and exceptionally talented musicians, we touched the lives of 129,436 adults and children through 95 concerts, education programs and community engagement initiatives, including almost 43,000 students who participated in virtual and in-person education programs.

The 2022/23 Season ushered in extraordinary levels of artistic distinction, charting the course towards a prosperous and bright future ahead. The following report celebrates the Jacksonville Symphony's strong commitment and belief in symphonic music as a way of uplifting and unifying our community. As one of Northeast Florida's most revered cultural institutions, we are proud to have made the following significant strides:

- Forging a resplendent, world-class artistic team comprised of Music Director Courtney Lewis, Concertmaster Adelya Nartadjieva, Associate Conductor Kevin Fitzgerald and Assistant Conductor Grant O'Brien.
- Creating a partnership with the Sphinx Organization, a social justice organization whose mission is to "transform lives through the power of diversity in the arts," that brought six Sphinx musicians to the stage to perform with the Symphony.
- Achieving a record high for total ticket revenue: \$3,405,839.
- Achieving a record high for Symphony Gala revenue: \$411,907.
- Awarding tenure to five Jacksonville Symphony musicians and our concertmaster.
- Selected to receive a competitive, two-year grant award from the Jessie Ball duPont Fund to further Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) efforts.
- Premiering the inaugural Jazz Concert curated by Principal Tuba James Jenkins.
- Jacksonville Symphony musicians performing alongside the GRAMMY® Award-winning Indigo Girls.

The 2022/23 David M. Hicks Piano Series featured four renowned guest artists, each bringing their unique style and immense talent to Jacoby Symphony Hall to perform some of the most virtuosic pieces in symphonic music.

Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky, Johannes Brahms, Sergei Rachmaninoff and Sergei Prokofiev: brilliance lies within all of their works, but it's their compositions centering on the piano in which they unleash their ingenuity most profoundly. From thunderous chords to passages ablaze with passion, these selections are cornerstones of classical music. In the span of the 2022/23 Season, Music Director Courtney Lewis and the Jacksonville Symphony united with globally acclaimed guest pianists, Tianxu An, Alessio Bax, Natasha Paremski and Conrad Tao, to present four masterpieces on our David M. Hicks Steinway concert grand piano. Each performance shined with diverse talent and expressions, creating four unforgettable programs in Jacoby Symphony Hall.

Artistic Leadership "In the News"



Music Director Courtney Lewis appeared as a guest conductor at several world-class venues in the 2022/23 Season. In August, he traveled to Los Angeles, California, to conduct the Los Angeles Philharmonic at the famous Hollywood Bowl in a program covering works from Clara Schumann to Antonín Dvořák featuring phenom pianist Isata Kanneh-Mason. In April, Lewis conducted the Paris Opera Ballet during select performances of *The Dante Project*, a ballet by composer Thomas Adès, at the Palais Garnier in Paris, France.

Concertmaster Adelya Nartadjieva celebrated her first official season with the Jacksonville Symphony, having earned a tenured position with the orchestra. Tenure is one of the highest professional achievements that a musician can receive and is difficult to obtain. Starting from the moment of their first audition, musicians must undergo a lengthy process that requires performing at their highest caliber and displaying the most advanced level of artistry in order to receive the prestigious title. Associate Conductor Kevin Fitzgerald traveled to Bamberg, Germany, for the 2023 Mahler Competition where he was awarded the special prize of Best Performance of the Contemporary Piece. While in Germany, Fitzgerald also had the honor of conducting the world premiere of Bernd Richard Deutsch's "con moto" (2023) with the Bamberg Symphony during the closing concert. Additionally, Fitzgerald was selected as one of 22 conductors to receive the 2023 Career Assistance Awards by The Solti Foundation U.S.

Assistant Conductor and JSYO Music Director

Grant O'Brien led the Symphony in multiple lively, educational programs throughout the 2022/23 Season. Approximately 1,300 students from 22 different schools across six districts benefited from the Young People's Concerts that took place in the Spring during which O'Brien and the musicians of the Symphony performed and educated the students.

Assistant Conductor Grant O'Brien led the Symphony in an evening that blurred the lines between folk, rock, pop and classical genres, resulting in a breathtaking fusion of song and symphonic sound.



OPERA: THE MAGIC FLUTE

The Jacksonville Symphony's largest and most enchanting production of the season, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's opera *The Magic Flute*, transported audiences straight into a fairytale with its all-star cast, exceptional visuals projected onto 30-foot-tall screens and storybook set design. Featuring acclaimed Stage Director Kristine McIntyre, this larger-than-life production was a thrill for operatic aficionados and newcomers alike.



COMMUNITY CONCERTS

As our way of saying thank you to the Jacksonville community for its continued support, two free Community Concerts presented by Haskell were held in September to kick off the 2022/23 Season. Associate Conductor Kevin Fitzgerald led the Symphony for the first time in his new position during these "sold-out" performances.

FIRST COAST NUTCRACKER

In the 2022/23 Season, the Jacksonville Symphony's *First Coast Nutcracker* celebrated its 50th anniversary. The production has a robust history as the only local performance of *The Nutcracker* performed with live music. The *First Coast Nutcracker* has also greatly expanded its audience reach by providing more than 4,700 students with the opportunity to attend special performances at reduced, accessible prices and providing 1,250 community service tickets to families throughout the First Coast each season.

The 2022/23 production set a record for revenue at \$457,430, demonstrating *The Nutcracker* as a beloved centerpiece of the holiday season.



JAZZ

On June 4, 2023, the Jacksonville Symphony held its inaugural *Jazz at the Jacksonville Symphony* performance. This special Sunday afternoon concert was the perfect way to showcase the talents of the newly formed Jacksonville Jazz Collective and give audiences a sneak peek into the Symphony's new Chase Jazz Series premiering in the 2023/24 Season. The Chase Jazz Series is curated by the Jacksonville Symphony's Principal Tuba and Jacksonville Jazz Collective Director James Jenkins.

DEI Initiatives & The Sphinx Program



The Jacksonville Symphony's mission is to enrich the human spirit through symphonic music. We are committed to fostering a culture that values and embraces Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.

A core principle of the Jacksonville Symphony's mission is to ensure that musical opportunities are made accessible to all through its robust Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) initiatives.

Part of the Symphony's DEI Strategy is to diversify audiences who attend the Symphony's concerts and to recruit and retain musicians from a wide variety of backgrounds and experiences. Partnering with the Symphony to create an orchestra that is reflective of the community it serves is the Sphinx Organization, founded in Detroit, Michigan, whose mission is to "transform lives through the power of diversity in the arts."


In the 2022/23 Season, the Symphony welcomed six Sphinx musicians to Jacoby Symphony Hall: full-season musicians Romona Merritt and Bradley Parrimore and substitute musicians Emilia Mettenbrink, Adrian Speyrer, Carlos Lozano and Maya Stone. The Jacksonville Symphony received a two-year, \$200,000 competitive grant award from the Jessie Ball duPont Fund in support of this program to increase racial diversity within the orchestra.

The Jacksonville Symphony also furthers its strong commitment to DEI initiatives through a three-year, \$75,000 Catalyst Fund Incubator Grant awarded by The League of American Orchestras. The League's three-year grant is made possible by support from The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation with additional support from the Paul M. Angell Family Foundation.





Education and Community Engagement



In addition to an extensive concert performance schedule each season, the Jacksonville Symphony is committed to making a difference in the lives of thousands of children by ensuring that each one has access to live symphonic music and the boundless learning it inspires. The Symphony is the largest provider of music education in Northeast Florida, serving thousands of students through in-person and virtual programs with a special emphasis on providing access to students attending Title I schools. As part of the Symphony's 2022/23 operating budget of \$12 million, 42,367 students were able to experience the joy of classical music through participation in the Symphony's various music education programs detailed on this page.

Jacksonville Symphony Youth Orchestras (JSYO)

- 193 students aged 7-21 received weekly, ability-level specific instruction from a team of professional conductors under the direction of JSYO Music Director Grant O'Brien.
- JSYO students in the six ensemble levels performed five concerts on the Jacoby Symphony Hall stage for family and friends.

Ensemble School Visits

• Small groups of two to six Jacksonville Symphony musicians presented 40 interactive and informal, age-appropriate ensemble performances to 8,185 students right in their schools.

Youth Concerts for Elementary School Students

- 2,906 students in grades 1-5 had access to live symphonic music through field trips to Youth Concerts at Jacoby Symphony Hall, stimulating their imaginations as they learned about different musical styles and composers and listened to age-appropriate orchestral performances.
- 20,760 students watched the virtual Youth Concert performances in their classrooms.



First Coast Nutcracker

- 4,734 students from 55 local schools attended two student matinee performances of the Jacksonville Symphony's *First Coast Nutcracker* ballet held in December 2022 in the Moran Theater featuring three professional dancers and 120 community dancers accompanied by the Jacksonville Symphony.
- Teachers received a link to an online Nutcracker Adventure Guide and Lesson Plan for use in the classroom prior to attending performances.

Jump Start Strings After School Instruction Program

• Throughout the 2022/23 school year, Symphony musicians provided free, weekly stringed-instrument instruction to 39 at-risk students at six Title I elementary schools in Duval County. These students attended after-school programs run by our collaborative partner, Communities In Schools.

Students at the Symphony

 457 middle and high school students attended the Symphony's Coffee concerts thanks to free or discounted tickets made available through school partnerships, including 100 students from across Northeast Florida who are members of 5,000 Role Models of Excellence, a dropout prevention program for at-risk male students.

Young Artist Workshops

• Grant O'Brien held working sessions with 273 students on repertoire, mini-masterclasses, mock adjudications and acted as an extra set of ears in rehearsals.

42,367 students participated in our music education programs, including 20,760 virtual participants.

40 Ensemble School Visits for 8,185 students.

More than 193 students from diverse backgrounds across Northeast Florida participate in JSYO.

JSYO students perform five concerts in Jacoby Symphony Hall per season.

273 students benefited from Student Workshop Conductor Visits.

60 Title I schools participated in music education programs.

4,734 students attended matinee performances of the *First Coast Nutcracker* (85% increase over FY22).
